PROGRAM NOTES

The ASIA PACIFIC LEGAL INSTITUTE (APLI) is proud to have the Georgetown University Law Center, the Dean Dinwoodey Center for Intellectual Property Studies of the George Washington University, and the Asia Pacific Intellectual Property Association of Taiwan join us in co-sponsoring the *1999 Summer Intellectual Property Training Program*. To provide the highest quality of instructing, maximum exposure to current issues, and yet with the least cost to our participants, our curricula is designed to allow participants to engage in direct discussions with leading experts in the field, to access the state-of-the-art technology, and to observe the actual policy shaping process from the perspective of business, government and the academia.

The *APLI 1999 Summer Intellectual Property Training Program* begins on *Monday, July 5, 1999* in Washington, D.C. Participants must report to Classroom 588, McDonough Hall of the Georgetown University Law Center at 9:00 AM (600 New Jersey Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20001; telephone: (202) 662-9000). The program for the Washington, D.C. segment includes various subjects on the current intellectual property protection and technology transfer policy in the United States, and visits to key agencies and major law firms to make first-hand, on-site observations of the issues discussed. This entails meetings with senior officials and leaders in the American intellectual property community. Note that the second week of the program will be conducted at the George Washington University Law School. Having successfully concluded this part of the course, participants are invited to the University of Washington School of Law in Seattle, WA where another series of subject-oriented lectures and discussions will follow in the last two weeks of the program. In addition, participants will conduct on-site visits to several key industry facilities to have further orientation of intellectual property management in the United States. While in Seattle, all participants are invited to participate in the annual *High Technology Protection Summit*, a two-day conference that get together leading experts in the field from around the world.

To accommodate our participants, the APLI has arranged with the Georgetown University Law Center to make available on-campus housing facilities, the Gewirz Student Center. A participant certainly has the option, however, to live off-campus or to make other on-campus residential arrangements. While in Seattle, participants will be staying at the University Inn. In addition, a complimentary breakfast of sorts will be served every morning in Classroom 200, from Monday to Friday, during the first two weeks in Washington, D.C.

The tuition covers all courses and visits in Washington, D.C. and Seattle, Washington. Note that the tuition does not include registration fee, lodging, food, text materials, books, airfare, local transportation and other miscellaneous expenses. No enrollment is permitted unless and until all tuition and fees are paid in full. Note that the tuition payment is non-refundable and non-transferable after *June 18, 1999*. Partial refund may be granted to participants (or their sponsoring organizations) who have duly notified APLI on or before that date of their cancellation or withdrawal, in whole or in part, from the program. The exact amount of refund shall be determined by APLI on a case-by-case basis.
