## PROGRAM NOTES

The Asia Pacific Legal Institute (APLI) is proud to have the Asian Law Program and the Center for Advanced Studies and Research on Intellectual Property (CASRIP) of the University of Washington, the Georgetown University Law Center, and the Asia Pacific Intellectual Property Association of Taiwan in co-sponsoring its *1998 Summer Intellectual Property Training Program*. To provide the highest quality of instructing, maximum exposure to current issues, and yet with the least cost to our participants, our curricula is designed to allow participants to engage in direct discussions with leading experts in the field, to access the state-of-the-art technology, and to observe the actual policy shaping process from the perspective of business, government and the academia.

The *APLI 1998 Summer Intellectual Property Training Program* begins on *Monday, July 6, 1998* in Washington, D.C. Participants must report to the Georgetown University Law Center at 9:00 AM. The program for the Washington, DC segment includes various subjects on the current intellectual property protection and technology transfer policy in the United States, and visits to key agencies and major law firms to make first-hand, on-site observations of the issues discussed. This entails meetings with senior officials and leaders in the American intellectual property community. Having successfully concluded this part of the course, participants are invited to the University of Washington School of Law in Seattle, WA where another series of subject-oriented lectures and discussions will follow. In addition, participants will conduct on-site visits to several key industry facilities to have further orientation of intellectual property management in the United States. While in Seattle, all participants are invited to participate in the annual *Pacific Rim High Technology Protection Practice Update*, a two-day conference that get together leading experts in the field from around the world.

To accommodate our participants, the APLI has arranged with the Georgetown University Law Center to make available on-campus housing facilities. A participant certainly has the option, however, to live off-campus or to make other on-campus residential arrangements. The APLI has also made arrangement for the participants' stay over at Seattle.

The tuition covers all courses and visits in Washington, D.C. and Seattle, Washington. Note that the tuition does not include registration fee, lodging, food, text materials, books, airfare, local transportation and other miscellaneous expenses. No enrollment is permitted unless and until all tuition and fees are paid in full.

The deadline for application has been extended to *June 19, 1998*. Although forms may be submitted by fax, no application will be processed, however, until all the materials are received (including registration fee being paid in full) on or before that date. APLI reserves the right to make adjustments to the curricula and schedule of this program.
